## Fabric Requirements

In the photo the on-point triangles and the borders are cut from the same fabric, the requirements are listed seperatly here.

| Eight Inch Blocks |  | 30 Finished Blocks |

| On-Point Triangles | 1 | $3 / 4$ |

## Sugested Gutting Layout



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## On-Point Setting Tríangles



1. Cut all 60 pieces of the $61 / 8$ inch squares diagonally into triangles. This can most easily be done by stacking the squares as high as you can rotary cut neatly (about 8 layers). This will make 120 triangles.

2. Sew a triangle to all 4 sides of your finished kaleidoscope blocks. Blocks should now be approx. $117 / 8$ inches square with seam allowances. Make adjustments as needed. The blocks will set into a quilt to be $113 / 8$ inch.

## Vertical Frames



1. Make a horizontal row of five blocks with a $117 / 8$ vertical frame between each, and at each end as illustrated.

## Horizontal Frames

1. Make the horizontal frames by sewing three pieces of the 22 inch pieces together to make to make seven strips.

2. Sew a horizontal frame to the top of all six rows as illustrated.

## Assemble the Rows



1. Assemble the rows as illustrated until all six are together.

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## Assemble the Quilt Top Center



1. Assemble the rows as illustrated until all six are together and attach the last horizontal frame to the bottom

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## Assemble the Quilt Top



1. Attach the vertical borders and then the horizontal borders. The quilt top is complete. Quilt as desired. Binding may be done as desired or cross cut 10 pieces of 2 inch wide fabric and fold in half to set on quilt and hand finish to about $5 / 8$ ".
