


Fabric Requirements



Eight Inch Blocks 12 Finished Blocks




Fabric A 2 1/4 Yards (includes 1/2 yard binding)



Fabric B 2 Yards

Suggested Cutting Layout

Optional- replace kit corners with Fabric A corners to match. Cut two strips 3 1/4 inch by the width of the fabric and then cut into twenty four 3 1/4 inch squares. Cut diagonally into 48 triangles for block corners.



On-Point Triangles

Cut 24 pieces
6 1/8 inches
Square

Vertical Inner Borders


Cut 2 Pieces
52 1/2 X 4 1/4 inches

Horizontal Inner Borders

Cut 2 Pieces
47 1/2 X 7 1/2 inches

Binding

cut seven 2" strips from Fabric A the width of the fabric for binding to finish 5/8 inches.



Vertical Outer Borders


Cut 2 Pieces
60 1/2 X 4 1/4 inches

Vertical Frames

Cut 16 pieces
1 3/4 X 11 7/8 inches

Horizontal Outer Borders

Cut 2 Pieces
55 1/2 X 7 1/2 inches




Horizontal Frames


Cut 10 pieces
1 3/4 X 20 1/8 inches

On-Point Setting Triangles

All Seams 1/4 inch




1. Cut all 24 pieces of the $6 \frac{1}{8}$ inch squares diagonally into triangles. This can most easily be done by stacking the squares as high as you can rotary cut neatly (about 8 layers). This will make 48 triangles.



2. Sew a triangle to all 4 sides of your finished kaleidoscope blocks. Blocks should now be approx. $11 \frac{7}{8}$ inches square with seam allowances. Make adjustments as needed. The blocks will set into a quilt to be $11 \frac{3}{8}$ inch.


Vertical Frames



1. Make a horizontal row of three blocks with a $11 \frac{7}{8}$ vertical frame between each, and at each end as illustrated. Repeat 4 times to make 4 rows.


Horizontal Frames

1. Make horizontal frames by sewing two pieces of the $20 \frac{3}{8}$ strips together to make five strips.




2. Sew a horizontal frame to the top of all four rows as illustrated.

Assemble the Rows




1. Assemble the rows as illustrated until all 4 are together

Assemble the Quilt Top Center



1. Assemble the rows as illustrated until all four are together and attach the last horizontal frame to the bottom

Add the Inner and Outer Borders



1. Add the vertical inner borders , then the horizontal inner borders. Check your progress at the halfway points as you go. Do the same for the outer borders. Quilt and bind as desired.
